

Guatemala: A Community that is Sent

Over spring break, H2O Ohio State teamed up with New Life at Wayne State University to serve our sister church in Guatemala City, Guatemala. Our days were split between working at a K-6th grade school and engaging with the Guatemalan community. In the school, we had the privilege of sharing the gospel with the children, discussing the meanings of various bible verses, teaching English, playing games at recess, and showering the kids with hugs and attention. It was incredible to see Jesus use our small efforts in amazing ways as the students would memorize scripture, take notes when we shared the gospel, remember our names, ask questions about God, and simply pour out their love on us with no hesitation.

However, the most devastating, challenging, and encouraging aspect of the trip occurred when we were able to visit the homes of five different children from the school where we worked. The homes were essentially dirt floor, one-to two-room shacks, and each family shared a different story of intense heart break (many of which included murder, extreme poverty, abandonment, and lack of work). The families invited us to enter into their pain and suffering, and our entire team wept with them as we were hit with the reality of the world's brokenness. Before leaving,

we were able to provide the families with some food and clothing, in addition to sharing the gospel and praying over them. We believe the Holy Spirit was moving, as many of the families clearly responded to the gospel with their questions and emotions. The pastor of the church in Guatemala will continue to follow up with these families and is committed to serving them as he is able so that he may continue to share the love of Christ with them. In summary, we witnessed firsthand the ways in which the Lord gives hope and provides healing, as well as the beauty of three churches uniting as one family to do the work of God's kingdom.

I grew up in a Christian home with a mother who always encouraged me to be involved at church from an early age. Thankfully, I was also blessed to be a part of a loving church family and was surrounded by people who encouraged me to pursue and develop my faith. As a result of their support and encouragement, I truly learned a lot early on about God's love for me and his character. I loved to be at church, and I was faithful to attend whatever events I could. However, despite all of my knowledge and involvement, I had never really engaged with the gospel or thought about what it meant for me. I knew who Jesus was and what he did for me, but I lacked a genuine understanding of what Jesus's life meant and, in turn, placed my faith instead in my own abilities and relationships. That is, until I came to college.

Honestly, I came to Ohio State not really having any idea what I was doing in the midwest. She invited me to come with her to an H2O service, and as I sang along to worship music I had never heard before and listened to another H2O member share her own Slice of Life, I recognized that there was something different about the people of this community and church. It was then that I decided that I wanted to be apart of it.

So, I joined an H2O team and was quickly connected to a small group of incredible women who showed me what it meant to for me to pursue God with my whole heart, and they gave me a greater picture of what community looks like. They shared deeply week after week, and I was amazed by the obvious love they had for each other and for God. Over of the course of my first year, I learned more and grew more in my faith than I could have ever expected, and after years of learning about God and his grace, I finally took the chance to pursue a personal relationship with Jesus. Since my return from Senegal, I have been able to apply the things I learned to my everyday life and to my volunteer work here in Columbus. Most recently, I was even able to attend a conference called Catalyze with some of my fellow H2O members to learn more about how to reach out to Muslims. I think it's amazing that I not only have the opportunity to reach out to Muslims, but that I get to do it with fellow H2O members and Christians! I may have come to Ohio State not really knowing what God had in store for me, but it's been incredible to see his plan play out and how he has surrounded me with a community that's better than anything I could have imagined.

I'm so excited to see what God has in store for my last year of college and for my time after graduation. I am eager to continue reaching out and serving Muslim communities and hope to venture to the Muslim world after I become an Ohio State alum! Surely God is so unbelievably good, and I am continually blown away by all he has taught within my time at Ohio State. I look forward to continuing to walk with the Lord for the rest of my life.
